Lotika, from Bangladesh, married in her teens.

"My husband didn't have a home so we lived under a roof with no walls and no floor. We were so poor we could only eat once a dav.

And then I became pregnant with my daughter. She became sick and lav on the ground. Every night I would cry myself to sleep."

#### A changed life... because of you

"But one day Baptist World Aid came to our village. They made roads, dug canals and built ponds. They encouraged me to join a self-help group where I learned tailoring. I took a loan from the group to buy a sewing machine so I could start my own business.

We now have enough to eat and my daughter can go to school. She won't have to marry early like me. I may have suffered much but she will not have to suffer."

## How it workes STEP-BY-STEP!

Fundraising made easy for you and your supporters so you can get on with the fun of your event!

#### **Choose your fundraiser**

Having a birthday? Getting married? Organising a fun run? Or perhaps you'd like to try a bake sale or trivia night? More ideas on pages 6-7 or you can apply to fundraise your way!

#### Create your profile

Go to **baptistworldaid.org.au/fundraise** and follow the simple instructions to set up your online fundraising page. Choose which cause you want to support – children in poverty, urgent disaster relief or ethical fashion research!

#### Tell your friends

Share, share, share!

Share your fundraising page via Facebook, Twitter or email. Ask them to donate online - it's so quick and simple! You can even use the "like" feature to thank supporters for their generosity on social media!

## How to Personalise Your Fundraising Page

Set up Set up your page and upload a photo.

Go to baptistworldaid.org.au/fundraise and set up your page. Be sure you use an active email address.

## 2 Your bio Write something about yourself or your team.

Let the world know who you are and why you want to fundraise for the cause you love.

## 3 Your \$ goal Set your goal and ask people to donate!

Tell everyone your fundraising target and why they should give to your chosen cause. Don't forget to make a donation yourself - fundraisers are more successful when supporters see you also give to the cause. Then ask them to support you and donate!

## 4 Blog posts Write blog posts for your friends.

Your friends want to hear from you! Let them catch the passion you have for your cause! Keep them up to date with how much you are raising and tell them about the difference it will make to those living in poverty.


#### 5 Share online Share with your friends.

## 2 each y Fundraising Ideas

Here are some ideas to get you started on fundraising to help children and families living in poverty. Make sure you give people plenty of notice and allow yourself enough time to book venues and organise food or other items if needed.

#### **MAKE IT PERSONAL**

Birthday

Do you want your birthday celebrations to be fun AND do some good this year? Instead of asking friends to buy you birthday gifts, why not invite them to support your fundraiser? You'll give them the satisfaction of making a difference to people living in poverty.

Wedding

Are you getting married and already have all you need? Then turn your celebration of love into a demonstration of loving generosity for those less fortunate. Ask your friends to mark your public commitment with a donation to help the world's most vulnerable people.

#### FOOD, GLORIOUS FOOD

Host a Breakfast, Lunch or Dinner

People love an excuse to have a meal together. Now you can raise funds for a good cause at the same time! Try a pancake breakfast, scones with jam and cream, a curry night, or whatever your culinary heart desires. Ask your friends to donate \$20-25 for their meal. Bake Sale

Time to roll up your sleeves and bake! Sell gingerbreads, cupcakes, chocolate slices, cookies, or truffles at your local church or in your workplace.

Sausage Sizzle

Pick your venue, source your snags, start them sizzling and you'll get people lining up to sink their teeth into a scrumptious sausage... for a little donation to help those living in poverty.

Movie & Pizza Night

Whether it's the latest blockbuster or a black and white classic, gather around with a favourite flick. Add pizza, drinks and awesome people who'll give to your fundraiser. It's a simple, fun way to help those who may struggle to afford even one meal a day.



### CHALLENGES & CLEANS

**Fun Run**Do you love to have fun?
Do you love to run? Why not combine the two and organise a Fun Run? What a great way to get fit, spend quality time with friends and family, and raise money to help end poverty! If taking part in a fun run, please make sure your event has less than 500 participants!

Brush up your general knowledge and host a trivia night at your local church or any other suitable venue! It's a great way to show everyone how clever you are and raise funds at the same time! Charge an entry fee and ask your local businesses to donate prizes.

#### Individual or group challenge

Organise a challenge and find sponsors who will support you to do something crazy for charity! Shave your head. Pour a bucket of ice over yourself. Wear a onesie to work. Read a book a day for a month. Go without social media for a fortnight. Or eat only rice for a week.

Car Wash
Let's face it - nobody
wants to get out the bucket and
hose to clean the car so host a
car wash and charge \$20 per
car cleaned! Your supporters will
get a sparkling car, the chance
to support your fundraiser and their Sunday arvo back.

#### **ETHICAL EVENTS**

Clothes Swap
Host a big one at church or a small one at home. Ask your supporters for a donation on entry then they can swap shoes, shirts, pants and purses galore. You'll clean out wardrobes, keep items out of landfill, and raise money to eradicate poverty.

12 Ethical Film Screening
Host a screening of The
True Cost. Discover the ugly
truth behind the clothes we
wear. Start a discussion about
ethical fashion and ending
worker exploitation. You'll
receive a screening pack which
has everything you need. Just
ask and we'll send you one!

### The Admin Stuff Made Easy

#### **Authority to fundraise**

You need a letter of authority to fundraise but that's not a problem! Just contact us after submitting your application to fundraise. We'll then send you the letter to verify you're officially fundraising on behalf of Baptist World Aid.

#### Insurance

It's your responsibility to check whether your fundraising event will need public liability or other kinds of insurance. If using an external venue, you should ask whether their insurance covers your planned event. (Baptist World Aid's insurance will not cover your fundraising activity.)
