- 2. What experience do you have in managing projects through the entire program management cycle? If possible, provide an example of managing a project that is funded through a grant mechanism where you had to ensure that grant requirements were met to high quality.
- 3. What experience do you have in working with and supporting Churches and non-Governmental organizations / implementing partners? Please provide examples that highlight your approach to relationship management and supporting organizational development?
- 4. Describe a situation / time in which you had multiple deadlines and priorities. How did you manage the conflicting deadlines and what was the outcome?
- 5. Provide an example of a time you have worked cross-culturally. What was the project? What difficulties did you encounter and what strategies did you put in place to overcome those difficulties? What was the outcome?
- 6. Please describe your faith as an authentic committed Christian.
